## NBGC After-School Programs

Our organizational goal is to provide youth leadership and peer mentoring. We pride ourselves on an 80+ year tradition of a program run for kids by kids. The After-School goal is for your child to participate in project-based activities, finish homework assignments, and get daily physical exercise. Our After-School programs can be custom-fit to meet your family's needs. We operate extended hours on days off and during school vacations. We provide a wide variety of sports, arts, and enrichment activities for every age group. With Neighborhood Boys & Girls Club Youth After-School programs, working parents are confident that their children are learning and playing in a safe and supportive environment after school.

NBGC Youth After-School programs currently operate at the clubhouse (Revere Park) and onsite at Coonley & Bateman Elementary Schools. A supervised walk to the clubhouse program will be available to Cleveland students, until enrollment levels allow for programs to be moved onsite at that school. School-age children who attend other schools, public or private, inside or outside the neighborhood, can attend the NBGC clubhouse after school program, but transportation is not provided. If your child is approved for CPS bus services, you can request a drop off at Revere Park, however not all requests are honored."

## We're There Where You Need Us!

The Neighborhood Boys & Girls Club Youth After-School Program provides essential childcare for working families with a variety of options.

### Daily After-School Care

The program is open for youth in Kindergarten-8th Grade from full day school dismissal until 6:00 PM almost every day that CPS schools are in session. You may register for daily occasional care or the full ten week session.

### Days Off School Care

The program will be open from 8:00 AM - 6:00 PM on CPS non-attendance days (see sessional information for dates). Program will meet at NBGC clubhouse.

### School Holiday Camps

We offer mini-camps during winter recess (December), and spring recess (March). You must register separately for the holiday camps.

### Athletic Programs

NBGC has a robust Athletic Program for K-8th Grade youth. After-School youth are encouraged to participate in the team athletics. The NBGC will walk youth from the on-site program to the Clubhouse on practice and game days, pick up will then be at the Clubhouse.

### Financial Aid and Sliding Scale Tuition

The Neighborhood Boys & Girls Club After-School program is a modest tuition of \$32.50 per week per child. NBGC accepts vouchers from the State Funded Illinois Action for Children program. Working parents with limited income who cannot qualify for Action for Children and are in need of after-school childcare may apply for reduced tuition. NBGC is scheduled to be open for all CPS emergency / strike closing days from 8:00 AM - 6:00 PM. All full time youth registered in the session that closing occurs will be allowed to attend for an additional charge of \$10.00 per child / per day.

Afterschool Program will be extended and modified if CPS calendar adds additional days due to emergency closing/strike days

## NBGC HISTORY

Robert Buehler and Richard Valentin founded the Neighborhood Boys & Girls Club in 1931, two important men whose vision and dedication have made the organization what it is today. The NBGC organization has been an integral part of the community for over 85 years. The Club is a non-profit organization **that is independent from any other Boys & Girls Club. Operations are supported solely by program fees, donations and fund-raisers. Membership is free to all youth.** NBGC offers a diversified athletic, social, recreational, cultural, computer, tutoring, leadership and scholarship program for boys and girls 5-18 years old. The rules are simple: everyone plays, develops at their own pace and respects each other. The program goes far beyond sports. **Leadership skills, new friendships, and most of all a pride in oneself and community** are the natural outcome of the unique Neighborhood Boys & Girls Club program. A unique aspect of the NBGC structure is its **Leadership Program**. College and high school aged members oversee all activities and work directly with the girls & boys. They supervise, officiate, and teach children of all ages. Leaders are selected based upon their dependability, attitude, and sportsmanship during their years as active members. Thousands of alumni still reside with the NBGC community, cherishing their youthful memories and maintaining their friendships. Today the year round program of the NBGC includes activities for over 1,500 boys & girls.
